## **WORLD SCOUT JAMBOREE 2019**

Toby Woodcock (Hardington Marsh) along with Bethan, Clare and Ruby from East Coker Scouts and Coker Crusaders have been selected to be members of the Somerset & Wiltshire Unit going to the 24<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree (WSJ) in North America next year.

The WSJ is the most prestigious event in Scouting and takes place every four years, each time hosted by a different country. The 24<sup>th</sup> WSJ will take place in West Virginia, USA in 2019. The event will see over 45,000 young people come together from 150 countries including over 3,000 young people from the UK (and just 27 from Somerset!).

Each UK scout needs to raise £3,995 to attend the Jamboree as well as undertake a lot of training to get ready for this fantastic adventure. This sum also supports other Scouts from around the world whose communities cannot meet the whole cost.

We have already started our fundraising efforts, running a tuck shop, cake sales at schools and bag packing. There will be lots of events over the next year including a Village Quiz in Hardington in October.

## **THE PARISH CLERK WRITES...**

### **The May Meeting...**

Two Planning applications were discussed. The first was for listed building consent for alterations including a new en-suite bathroom and a new external boiler at Corner Cottage, Bishops Lane. The second was for a revised application for a detached double garage with a store above, and a two-storey side extension to Oakenlea on West Coker Hill. There were no objections to either.

The Parish Council heard that permission had now been granted to remove the agricultural tie from Walnut Tree Farm on Lyatts Hill.

The Final recommendations regarding the Electoral Review of South Somerset ward boundaries have been received from the Local Government Boundary Commission. The Parish Council were pleased to receive news that Hardington will remain in the Coker Ward rather than being moved to the Parrett ward as was initially proposed in the draft recommendations.

The Bike track at the community field has been treated with herbicide in order to kill the weeds before further gravel is added. It was noted that the community field litter bins were overflowing following the bank holiday weekend. The Parish Council would be grateful if users could take large quantities of litter home with them, rather than fill the bins unnecessarily.

The next scheduled Parish Council meeting will be at 7.30 in the Village Hall on the 19th June and the public can speak for a limited amount of time at the start. ## **HARDINGTON WILDLIFE**

It is amazing how our wildlife has reacted to the glorious sunshine in late May after such miserable weather before. Forecast of things being three or four weeks late suddenly vanish as nature goes in to catch up mode. May has been a very busy month as flowers shoot up and most birds are nesting. Even the weeds in the garden seem to have extra energy.

Butterflies are said to have suffered badly in the last 12 months but here we are seeing plenty of brimstones and orange tips and single specimens of others we would expect to see in May. Hopefully a good summer will help them to bounce back.

Most birds are now nesting, so be careful not to disturb hedges, ivy-covered trees and other possible nesting sites. RSPB is saying that during hot dry weather swallows and house martins still need a supply of mud to build and repair their nests.

Wildflowers in Hardington Moor National nature reserve seem ready to give a good display in June and July and it should be possible to find at least six species of orchid. Please note that Natural England will be supporting open farm Sunday on June 10th from 10 till 4 pm with an information tent and guided walks starting at the top field entrance.

The final piece of news – two sightings of red kites during May, – and we are still hoping they will soon come to stay and nest.
