THE PARISH CLERK WRITES... The June Meeting...

The meeting began with Tina Steele being co-opted to fill the remaining PC vacancy and she then joined the meeting.

Cllr Carpenter reported that he had met with Chris Turner, Cllr Patrick, and Lee Norman (Highways officer) in Hardington recently, and visited various sites to discuss road issues. Lee Norman will be writing a report on this meeting. Cllr Carpenter reported that unfortunately Moor Lane was not considered bad enough to make it on to the future jobs list, but Lyatts Hill surface issues will be repaired. Contractors have now carried out repairs to the bank collapsing at the bottom of Lyatts.

There will be a temporary Road Closure on the High Street, 3rd July 2025 (08:30 - 16:00) to enable Wessex Water to carry out 'frame and cover repair works'.

Chris Turner has decided to step down from Highways representative and the Parish Council would like to thank him for all his hard work in the last year.

Somerset Highway's team have said that due to funding they will not be able to repair the tarmac of the footpath from Moor Lane to the Village shop (Y10/51). (The Rights of Way also do not have the means to repair tarmac paths). The PC have therefore decided that the CIL money received for the land north of Tall Elms development could be used to repair this footpath. A discussion took place to decide whether tarmac or concrete would be more suitable. The Clerk agreed to seek a contractor's advice on this.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, 15th July, 7.30pm at the Village Hall. The public can speak for a limited amount of time at the start.
